PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Encourage your child to participate, have fun and work hard;
- Teach your child that "doing their best" is more important than winning;
- > Be mindful and respectful when cheering/chanting at games. Be a fan, not a fanatic:
- > Yelling and the use of inappropriate language toward players, coaches, officials, opponents or anyone involved in the soccer environment will not be tolerated;
- > Parents are responsible to support coaching staff, as well as refrain from undermining their authority or criticizing in public;
- > Criticism must be discussed with the appropriate personnel and settling when situations related directly to one's child(ren) arise.
- > Gossiping to other parents in relation to Van Isle Wave Program will not be tolerated at anytime;
- > Parents also represent the program, and are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and courteous manner, following program's rules, policies, and procedures.
- > Parents who don't follow those guidelines are subject to probation, which can lead to further disciplinary actions.

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
